A hands-on workshop hosted by artist David Lupton

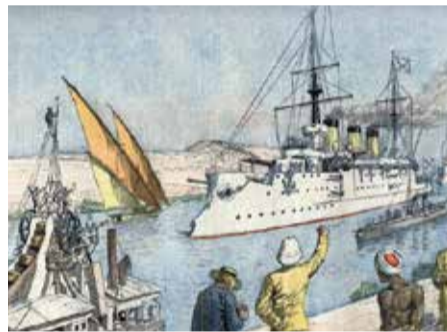
Join us as David Lupton shares his journey of discovery of pressed flower photography. He will take you through an interactive session where you will learn to make jewellery using pressed flowers.
